C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act

The following conditions are only applicable to Approved projects.

- 1. Failure to comply with all conditions stated herein, and with all related statutes and other regulatory measures, shall be deemed cause to revoke or modify this Order.
- 2. The Order does not grant any property rights or any exclusive privileges; it does not authorize any injury to private property or invasion of private rights.
- 3. This Order does not relieve the permittee or any other person of the necessity of complying with all other applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances, bylaws, or regulations.
- 4. The work authorized hereunder shall be completed within three years from the date of this Order unless either of the following apply:
 - a. the work is a maintenance dredging project as provided for in the Act; or
 - b. the time for completion has been extended to a specified date more than three years, but less than five years, from the date of issuance. If this Order is intended to be valid for more than three years, the extension date and the special circumstances warranting the extended time period are set forth as a special condition in this Order.
- 5. This Order may be extended by the issuing authority for one or more periods of up to three years each upon application to the issuing authority at least 30 days prior to the expiration date of the Order.
- 6. If this Order constitutes an Amended Order of Conditions, this Amended Order of Conditions does not extend the issuance date of the original Final Order of Conditions and the Order will expire on 5/16/2010 unless extended in writing by the Department.
- 7. Any fill used in connection with this project shall be clean fill. Any fill shall contain no trash, refuse, rubbish, or debris, including but not limited to lumber, bricks, plaster, wire, lath, paper, cardboard, pipe, tires, ashes, refrigerators, motor vehicles, or parts of any of the foregoing.
- 8. This Order is not final until all administrative appeal periods from this Order have elapsed, or if such an appeal has been taken, until all proceedings before the Department have been completed.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

- 9. No work shall be undertaken until the Order has become final and then has been recorded in the Registry of Deeds or the Land Court for the district in which the land is located, within the chain of title of the affected property. In the case of recorded land, the Final Order shall also be noted in the Registry's Grantor Index under the name of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is to be done. In the case of the registered land, the Final Order shall also be noted on the Land Court Certificate of Title of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is done. The recording information shall be submitted to the Conservation Commission on the form at the end of this Order, which form must be stamped by the Registry of Deeds, prior to the commencement of work.
- 10. A sign shall be displayed at the site not less then two square feet or more than three square feet in size bearing the words,

"Massachusetts Department of Environme	ental Protection" [or, "MassDEP"]
"File Number 208-087	3 "

- 11. Where the Department of Environmental Protection is requested to issue a Superseding Order, the Conservation Commission shall be a party to all agency proceedings and hearings before MassDEP.
- 12. Upon completion of the work described herein, the applicant shall submit a Request for Certificate of Compliance (WPA Form 8A) to the Conservation Commission.
- 13. The work shall conform to the plans and special conditions referenced in this order.
- 14. Any change to the plans identified in Condition #12 above shall require the applicant to inquire of the Conservation Commission in writing whether the change is significant enough to require the filing of a new Notice of Intent.
- 15. The Agent or members of the Conservation Commission and the Department of Environmental Protection shall have the right to enter and inspect the area subject to this Order at reasonable hours to evaluate compliance with the conditions stated in this Order, and may require the submittal of any data deemed necessary by the Conservation Commission or Department for that evaluation.
- 16. This Order of Conditions shall apply to any successor in interest or successor in control of the property subject to this Order and to any contractor or other person performing work conditioned by this Order.
- 17. Prior to the start of work, and if the project involves work adjacent to a Bordering Vegetated Wetland, the boundary of the wetland in the vicinity of the proposed work area shall be marked by wooden stakes or flagging. Once in place, the wetland boundary markers shall be maintained until a Certificate of Compliance has been issued by the Conservation Commission.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

18. All sedimentation barriers shall be maintained in good repair until all disturbed areas have been fully stabilized with vegetation or other means. At no time shall sediments be deposited in a wetland or water body. During construction, the applicant or his/her designee shall inspect the erosion controls on a daily basis and shall remove accumulated sediments as needed. The applicant shall immediately control any erosion problems that occur at the site and shall also immediately notify the Conservation Commission, which reserves the right to require additional erosion and/or damage prevention controls it may deem necessary. Sedimentation barriers shall serve as the limit of work unless another limit of work line has been approved by this Order.

NOTICE OF STORMWATER CONTROL AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 19. The work associated with this Order (the "Project") is (1) ☐ is not (2) ✓ subject to the Massachusetts Stormwater Standards. If the work is subject to the Stormwater Standards, then the project is subject to the following conditions:
 - a) All work, including site preparation, land disturbance, construction and redevelopment, shall be implemented in accordance with the construction period pollution prevention and erosion and sedimentation control plan and, if applicable, the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan required by the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Construction General Permit as required by Stormwater Condition 8. Construction period erosion, sedimentation and pollution control measures and best management practices (BMPs) shall remain in place until the site is fully stabilized.
 - b) No stormwater runoff may be discharged to the post-construction stormwater BMPs unless and until a Registered Professional Engineer provides a Certification that: *i.* all construction period BMPs have been removed or will be removed by a date certain specified in the Certification. For any construction period BMPs intended to be converted to post construction operation for stormwater attenuation, recharge, and/or treatment, the conversion is allowed by the MassDEP Stormwater Handbook BMP specifications and that the BMP has been properly cleaned or prepared for post construction operation, including removal of all construction period sediment trapped in inlet and outlet control structures; *ii.* as-built final construction BMP plans are included, signed and stamped by a Registered Professional Engineer, certifying the site is fully stabilized;

iii. any illicit discharges to the stormwater management system have been removed, as per the requirements of Stormwater Standard 10;

iv. all post-construction stormwater BMPs are installed in accordance with the plans (including all planting plans) approved by the issuing authority, and have been inspected to ensure that they are not damaged and that they are in proper working condition; *v.* any vegetation associated with post-construction BMPs is suitably established to withstand erosion.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

- c) The landowner is responsible for BMP maintenance until the issuing authority is notified that another party has legally assumed responsibility for BMP maintenance. Prior to requesting a Certificate of Compliance, or Partial Certificate of Compliance, the responsible party (defined in General Condition 18(e)) shall execute and submit to the issuing authority an Operation and Maintenance Compliance Statement ("O&M Statement) for the Stormwater BMPs identifying the party responsible for implementing the stormwater BMP Operation and Maintenance Plan ("O&M Plan") and certifying the following: *i.*) the O&M Plan is complete and will be implemented upon receipt of the Certificate of Compliance, and *ii.*) the future responsible parties shall be notified in writing of their ongoing legal responsibility to operate and maintain the stormwater management BMPs and implement the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan.
- d) Post-construction pollution prevention and source control shall be implemented in accordance with the long-term pollution prevention plan section of the approved Stormwater Report and, if applicable, the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan required by the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Multi-Sector General Permit.
- e) Unless and until another party accepts responsibility, the landowner, or owner of any drainage easement, assumes responsibility for maintaining each BMP. To overcome this presumption, the landowner of the property must submit to the issuing authority a legally binding agreement of record, acceptable to the issuing authority, evidencing that another entity has accepted responsibility for maintaining the BMP, and that the proposed responsible party shall be treated as a permittee for purposes of implementing the requirements of Conditions 18(f) through 18(k) with respect to that BMP. Any failure of the proposed responsible party to implement the requirements of Conditions 18(f) through 18(k) with respect to that BMP shall be a violation of the Order of Conditions or Certificate of Compliance. In the case of stormwater BMPs that are serving more than one lot, the legally binding agreement shall also identify the lots that will be serviced by the stormwater BMPs. A plan and easement deed that grants the responsible party access to perform the required operation and maintenance must be submitted along with the legally binding agreement.
- f) The responsible party shall operate and maintain all stormwater BMPs in accordance with the design plans, the O&M Plan, and the requirements of the Massachusetts Stormwater Handbook.



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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (cont.)

- g) The responsible party shall:
 - 1. Maintain an operation and maintenance log for the last three (3) consecutive calendar years of inspections, repairs, maintenance and/or replacement of the stormwater management system or any part thereof, and disposal (for disposal the log shall indicate the type of material and the disposal location);
 - 2. Make the maintenance log available to MassDEP and the Conservation Commission ("Commission") upon request; and
 - 3. Allow members and agents of the MassDEP and the Commission to enter and inspect the site to evaluate and ensure that the responsible party is in compliance with the requirements for each BMP established in the O&M Plan approved by the issuing authority.
- h) All sediment or other contaminants removed from stormwater BMPs shall be disposed of in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- i) Illicit discharges to the stormwater management system as defined in 310 CMR 10.04 are prohibited.
- j) The stormwater management system approved in the Order of Conditions shall not be changed without the prior written approval of the issuing authority.
- k) Areas designated as qualifying pervious areas for the purpose of the Low Impact Site Design Credit (as defined in the MassDEP Stormwater Handbook, Volume 3, Chapter 1, Low Impact Development Site Design Credits) shall not be altered without the prior written approval of the issuing authority.
- I) Access for maintenance, repair, and/or replacement of BMPs shall not be withheld. Any fencing constructed around stormwater BMPs shall include access gates and shall be at least six inches above grade to allow for wildlife passage.

F. Appeals

The applicant, the owner, any person aggrieved by this Order, any owner of land abutting the land subject to this Order, or any ten residents of the city or town in which such land is located, are hereby notified of their right to request the appropriate MassDEP Regional Office to issue a Superseding Order of Conditions. The request must be made by certified mail or hand delivery to the Department, with the appropriate filing fee and a completed Request of Departmental Action Fee Transmittal Form, as provided in 310 CMR 10.03(7) within ten business days from the date of issuance of this Order. A copy of the request shall at the same time be sent by certified mail or hand delivery to the Conservation Commission and to the applicant, if he/she is not the appellant.

Any appellants seeking to appeal the Department's Superseding Order associated with this appeal will be required to demonstrate prior participation in the review of this project. Previous participation in the permit proceeding means the submission of written information to the Conservation Commission prior to the close of the public hearing, requesting a Superseding Order, or providing written information to the Department prior to issuance of a Superseding Order.

The request shall state clearly and concisely the objections to the Order which is being appealed and how the Order does not contribute to the protection of the interests identified in the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (M.G.L. c. 131, § 40), and is inconsistent with the wetlands regulations (310 CMR 10.00). To the extent that the Order is based on a municipal ordinance or bylaw, and not on the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act or regulations, the Department has no appellate jurisdiction.

SUGGESTED SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR THE LAKE SHIRLEY AQUATIC MANAGEMENT PROGRAM ORDER OF CONDITIONS

- 1. The Conservation Commission shall be notified in writing at least 48 hours prior to application of any algaecide to Lake Shirley.
- 2. Algae treatment is allowed only if documented to be necessary and shall be documented in writing to the Conservation Commission prior to treatment.
- The LSIC will monitor algal populations and water clarity weekly beginning no later than
 mid June and continuing throughout mid September. Samples will be collected from each of
 the three basins. An algal expert will perform the algal identification and counts.
- 4. Copper sulfate shall be allowed when one or more of the following need criteria are met: 1) a reduction in water clarity approaching 4.5 feet, 2) algae composition is dominated by blue-green algae and cell counts exceed 25,000-50,000 cells per ml or more, 3) blue-green algae clumps become visually apparent on the water surface. The final decision to move forward with treatment will rest with the Conservation Agent, designated representatives of the LSIC Board of Directors and Aquatic Control.
- Prior to algaecide treatment, the consultant/contractor or LSIC shall provide and post signs on the shoreline of Lake Shirley warning of the temporary water use restrictions at least 48 hours before the application.
- Application dosage will not exceed 0.1 ppm as metallic copper.
- The Conservation Commission shall be notified in writing at least one week prior to application of any herbicide to Lake Shirley.
- 8. In late spring of each year a vegetation inspection/survey of the lake will be performed and the need for treatment would be established and the treatment plan (area and method) proposed. Designated members of the LSIC Board of Directors and the Conservation Agent will be allowed to accompany the contractor and provide input on the treatment plan. The following needs criteria will be used to determine need and areas of treatment: 1) invasive plant cover and biomass, 2) degree of recreational impairment, 3) degree of fish/wildlife habitat impairment, 4) potential for spread into non-infested areas of the lake.
- 9. There will no treatment within a 5-foot wildlife habitat preservation zone around the lake shoreline.
- 10. Prior to herbicide treatment, the consultant/contractor or LSIC shall provide and post signs on the shoreline of Lake Shirley warning of the temporary water use restrictions at least 48 hours before the application. These signs shall also be posted at Catacunemaug Road and Main Street in Shirley at their intersection with Catacunemaug Brook. Signs shall also be

placed one mile downstream. This warning and a short description of the treatment shall be placed in a newspaper of local circulation (Shirley and Lunenburg) prior to application.

- 11. Prior to treatment with Sonar, in subsequent years of the program, the contractor and LSIC will prepare a plan (including area, target plants, methodology, herbicide formulation and target dose) which will be submitted to the Conservation Commission for their review and approval. This will include a public hearing (including shorefront property owner notification) for public input and comments.
- 12. Application of all herbicides/algaecides shall be by an applicator licensed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The applicant shall supply the Shirley Conservation Commission with a copy of an approved Massachusetts DEP *License to Apply Chemicals* prior to any chemical application.
- 13. Following the application of Reward or Sonar to Lake Shirley, two active, shallow, private wells in close proximity to the lake will tested. The wells will be selected by the LSIC and approved by the Conservation Commission. Each of the two wells will be samples according to the following schedule. For Reward, samples will be collected 3-days and 5 days post-treatment. For Sonar, samples will be collected 7 days and 14 days post-treatment. The results of the testing will be forwarded within 3 days from their receipt from the laboratory.
- 14. The rate of herbicide/algaecide application shall be in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations and within the guidelines of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection and the USEPA and at concentrations no higher than as described in the Notice of Intent submission.
- 15. Precautions shall be taken to prevent spillage of chemicals during the application.
- 16. The herbicide/algaecide treatments and overall lake management program shall be performed in a manner consistent with the Massachusetts GEIR (2004) for Eutrophication & Aquatic Plant Management in Massachusetts.
- 17. In late July of each year during the period of this permit, an annual lake vegetation surveys will be conducted by a qualified third party contractor.
- 18. An annual project completion report shall be provided to the Conservation Commission on or before November 30. This report shall include the application dates, locations, and rates and justification for applications (plant surveys and densities), as well as any anecdotal information regarding complaints, fish kills, etc. The annual report must also contain information on strategies, plans and actions to pursue alternate methods of nuisance plant control and watershed nutrient source reduction.
- Application in future years is dependent on whether the conditions of the Order of Conditions are met.
